Dear Parents,

Firstly I would like to thank you for your support over this testing half term. Your vigilance and support of our health and safety regime in school has enabled the return to school to be as normal as possible for the children. We have been fortunate that we have not had to shut any bubbles and have not had any positive cases in school but we will need to continue to stick to our guidance, particularly with cases rising at this time. Thank you for your continued support. The Coronavirus update below is a reminder of the guidance from Herts County Council.

The teachers were grateful to all the parents who took part in parent consultations remotely and I hope you found these useful to hear about your child's progress. The majority of you were able to connect via Google. Those who experienced difficulties were contacted by phone. For those parents who teachers were not able to reach, we will contact them after half term. Thank you for your patience as we embed our Google G-Suite. This will be the platform for home learning, so any difficulties highlighted are worth sorting out for the future.

Coronavirus Update

If your child tests positive for coronavirus at any point during half-term, please notify us as soon as possible so we can complete the relevant tracking and tracing process with public health and notify any other children or staff who have been close contacts and need to self-isolate. During half-term you should continue to use admin@cuthbertmayne.herts.sch.uk to keep us informed.

Remember as soon as your child or any member of your household develops symptoms, they must start self-isolating immediately and book a test.

Main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste – this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If you're not sure whether symptoms suggest that they have coronavirus or an everyday cough or cold, you can consult this online NHS symptom checker:

Please do not send children back to nursery or school if any of the following apply:

- they have symptoms of COVID-19
- they, any members of your household, or any close contacts (including extended family or friends they have seen and bubbles at half-term activities and sports clubs) have tested positive for COVID-19
- they haven't completed the full 14 day isolation period requested
