Children's Well Being

Next week is Mental Health Awareness week. As a school we are constantly striving to support children's well-being – whether supporting as a whole class, small groups and individual mentoring. There are several associated activities going on in school:

Rainbows

We are pleased to let you know that we are now a Rainbows school. Rainbows is a worldwide organisation to support children who have suffered a loss of any kind. It is a 12-week programme (40minutes a week) that helps children understand their feelings and the emotions of grief/loss – be it a family member; a separation or a significant move away from extended family. We now have four trained facilitators and we hope to be running groups (3-5 pupils in a group) after half term. We will write to parents of pupils we feel may gain strength from this support requesting consent to join one of our groups. Everyone deals with grief in different ways and we will be guided by you before including any child with this support.

NSPCC visit

The National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children visited us on Monday and brought along their mascot Buddy as part of their nationwide Speak Out / Stay Safe campaign. The children were told that they had the right to speak out; be safe; and to get help when they need it should they suffer any form of abuse. They were very good at identifying trusted adults and were taught the number for Childline – 08001111 – should they ever need it.

Social Media / online safety – please see my attached letter regarding the dangers to our children from cyber-bullying and how children using certain APPs could be vulnerable to grooming. We are planning a parent information evening in early March. This is not a danger they face in school but, with increased access to social media at a younger age, it is noticeably affecting our pupils' well being.

They were all given piggy banks and goodies while learning about ATMs, mortgages, savings and credit cards.
