Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back after the Easter Holidays. As always it is so lovely to see the children back in school and they have settled straight into learning with enthusiasm. Covid Update

The revised parent guidance is on our website under Covid-19 Updates.

Key points for the new term are:

- parents will be asked to judge when their child is fit for school after having Covid (no set isolation).
