## Curriculum Development

A school's curriculum sets out what children need to know and by when. Often there is a lot of knowledge that needs to be learnt and understood along with skills too.

We teach 13 separate subjects in KS2 - that's a lot of learning! That's why recent research has shown that a well constructed curriculum is one of the most important aspects of ensuring an excellent quality of education.

As a school, we are currently working to make make our curriculum offer even better.

## Questioning and feedback

Every child is expected to think in every lesson. You wouldn't expect to get stronger and fitter by watching others exercise and this principle underpins our focus on effective questioning.

Children have to do their own thinking if they expect to learn!

## Improving Writing

To support their writing, children complete daily grammar focused activities that link directly to their current writing targets set out in their 'toolkits'. Children have also been working to ensure that they produce their very best writing in whatever subject they are completing.

Mrs Bance has also continued to support our writing focus through teaching handwriting along with other basic but essential skills. The impact she has had on children's outcomes has been excellent.
