

Multiplication Tables Check MTC

In June 2024 the children will be taking the government's statutory Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). We will be sending home more information about this test which covers all the times tables up to 12×12 .

We teach times tables as part of our maths lessons and children will take weekly times tables tests. A copy of a class test is below.


Here is an example of the spelling sheet that will be sent home on Mondays.

At the bottom of the sheet is where you will find the speed spell score and any words your child got wrong.






Reading

On Friday English AND Maths Homework will be given to your child which should take half an hour for each subject. It is to be handed in on the following Friday.


Each half term RE homework will be set instead of English homework.
